Course Overview

This is an introductory statistics class for students in the College of Arts and Sciences. The course emphasizes interpretation rather than computation. We require no calculus and JMP software will do some of the more complicated calculations. We will do quite a bit of data analysis. Most of the data sets will come from the social sciences (mainly psychology) and medicine.
