Finance 100 – Corporate Finance, Fall 2018 The Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania

Course Description

The purpose of this course is to introduce techniques of financial analysis, with applications to corporate finance. The concepts developed in Finance 100 form the foundation for all elective finance courses. The main topics covered include (1) the time value of money and the net present value rule; (2) capital budgeting decisions; (3) valuation of bonds and stocks; (4) uncertainty and the tradeoff between risk and return; (5) corporate financing decisions; (6) options.

Problem Sets

All assignments are due in class. Please submit a paper copy in your own section so that your grade can be entered into Canvas properly. Email assignments will not be accepted. Your two lowest homework scores will be dropped. Late assignments will not be accepted.

Grading

Grades will be based on the midterm exams (25% for the first, 25% for the second), the problem sets (10%), participation (5%), and the final exam (35%). All exams will integrate materials from the beginning of the semester. You will be allowed one double-sided page of notes for the first midterm, two double-sided pages for the second, and three double-sided pages for the final. You will need a calculator for the exams. Cell phones or laptops are not allowed during exams. Your lowest midterm grade will be replaced by your score on the final if that increases your performance.

Lectures

If possible, please go through the lecture notes *before* each class. Please be on time, because we will take attendance and answer simple question(s) from each lecture using Mentimeter, and often at the beginning of the lecture. If you do not use a smartphone, you can submit your answer on a piece of paper. Your Mentimeter answer will not be scored, but your participation in

classroom and Piazza discussion will be counted toward the 5% of the final grade. You are allowed (but discouraged) to be absent for three lectures without affecting your participation grade. Missing more than 3 lectures implies a loss of the total 5% participation grade.
